Protectical Information

CUSTOMS & VISA

The customs service is dedicated to supporting cruise lines with all customs formalities and offers streamlined procedures while ensuring full compliance with existing regulations. Passengers from various countries, including Australians, New Zealanders, Americans, EU citizens, and Japanese, among others, are exempt from visa requirements during their stopover, provided they meet specific conditions. Foreign visitors must hold a passport valid for at least three months beyond their visit to New Caledonia. Crew members are governed by the regulations outlined in the London Convention, based on their status.

PILOTAGE

In New Caledonia's inland waters, including Grande Terre, the Loyalty Islands, Isle of Pines, and outer islands, pilotage is mandatory for vessels exceeding 60 meters in length. Pilotage and towing fees are payable directly to the towing company and the pilots' union. Certain conditions allow exemptions for large yachts ranging from 60 to 80 meters in length.

TOUR OPERATORS & EXCURSIONS

At each port of call, including Nouméa, Lifou, Maré, and the Isle of Pines, cruise passengers benefit from a centralised location where approximately fifteen

English-speaking tour operators provide over fifty excursions tailored for them. These terminals offer various complimentary amenities such as markets, WiFi, and restroom facilities. This setup facilitates exploration of the capital and its surroundings through both group and private tours, encompassing city tours, island visits, water and land-based activities, and opportunities to be immersed in Kanak culture and tribal life on the islands.

P.A.N.C. SERVICES

The Noumea port of call, managed by the Autonomous Port of New Caledonia, provides comprehensive services for visiting ships. Vessels can conveniently access fuel, high-quality drinking water, and supplies directly from the quay. Bunkering operations adhere strictly to international safety standards. Additionally, a compulsory shuttle service ensures easy access to a vibrant ferry terminal during each cruise call. Here, visitors can find a tourist information centre, a market showcasing local creations, and a section dedicated to tour operators offering day trips.

PORT CHARGES

Cruise ships receive a 50% discount on entry fees, payable only at the first port of call in New Caledonia, and there are no docking charges in Noumea. However, it should be noted that tariff regulations will gradually evolve over the next few years, including the introduction of a cruise tax to support the sector's development in New Caledonia.

BIOSECURITY RULES

New Caledonia has implemented stringent phytosanitary regulations to safeguard its diverse animal and plant species. The disposal of food waste upon arrival is strictly prohibited, while other waste types may be disposed of on a caseby-case basis, subject to approval from biosecurity authorities following proper notification.

AIR CONNECTIONS

New Caledonia serves as a central hub for the South Pacific islands, with convenient air connections provided by airlines such as Aircalin, Qantas, Air New Zealand, Fiji Airways, and Air Vanuatu. These carriers offer direct flights from major locations including Australia, Fiji, Japan, New Zealand, Singapore, Vanuatu, and French Polynesia, facilitating easy team rotations and travel.

HEAD OF THE LINE

New Caledonia is well-equipped to receive small and medium-sized cruise liners, sparing travellers several days at sea. With convenient air access and a wide range of accommodations, passengers from around the globe can easily reach the archipelago before embarking.
